## MOVIE SCREENING- 10:30, CHALEIN



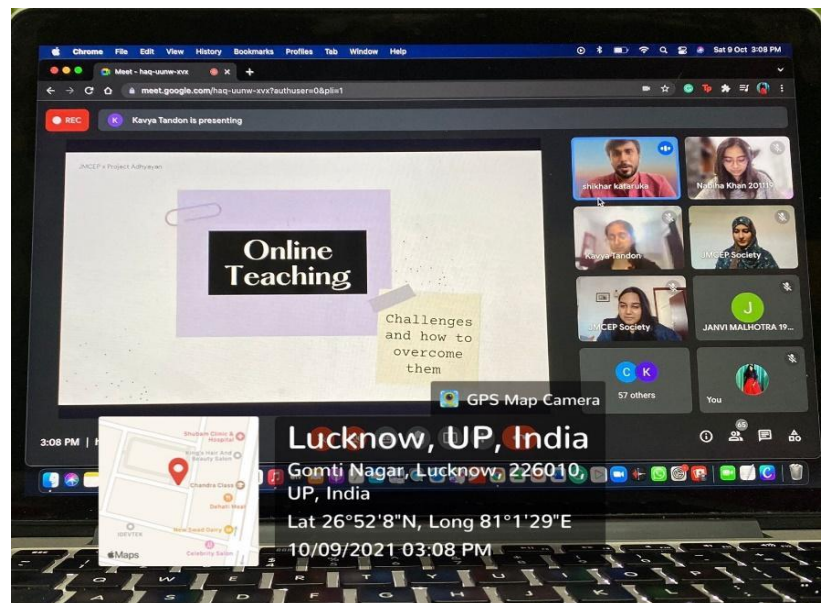
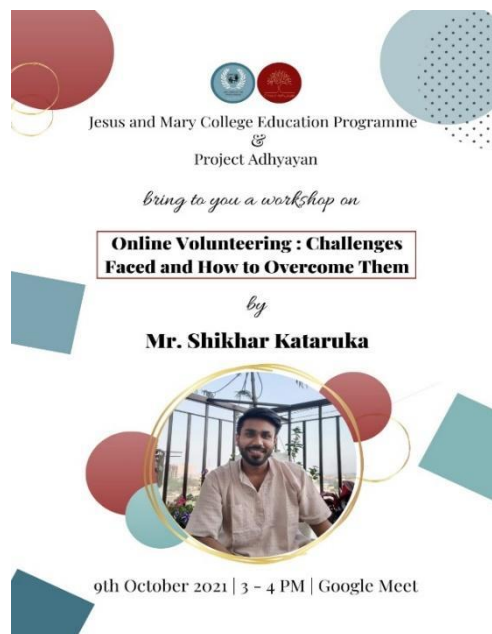

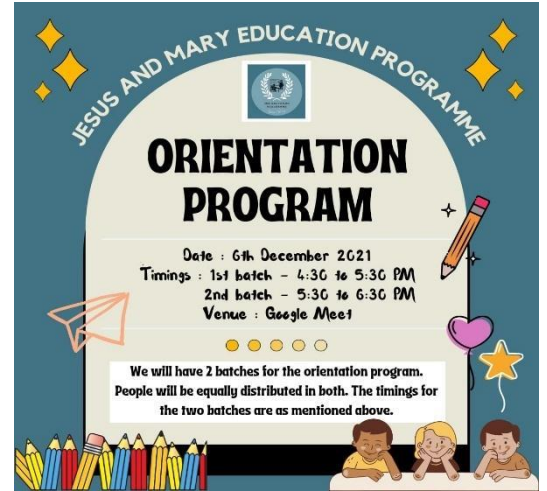
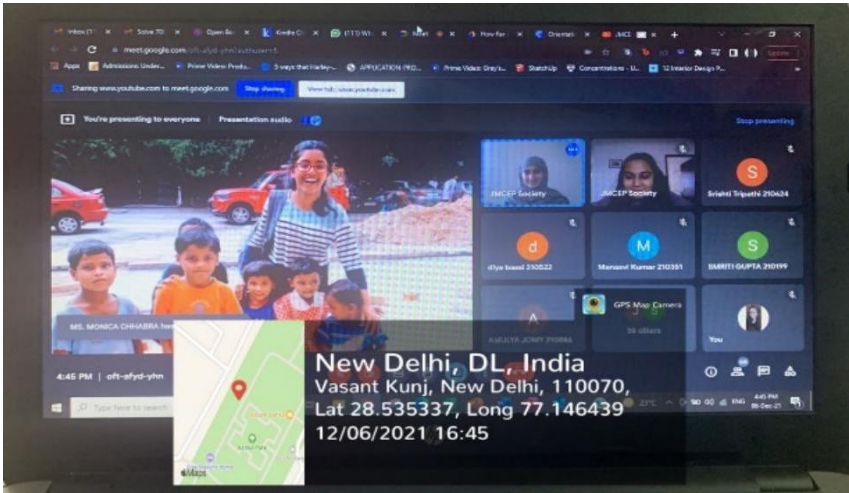
**Date of Event** – 27th October 2021

## ORIENTATION (FIRST YEARS)



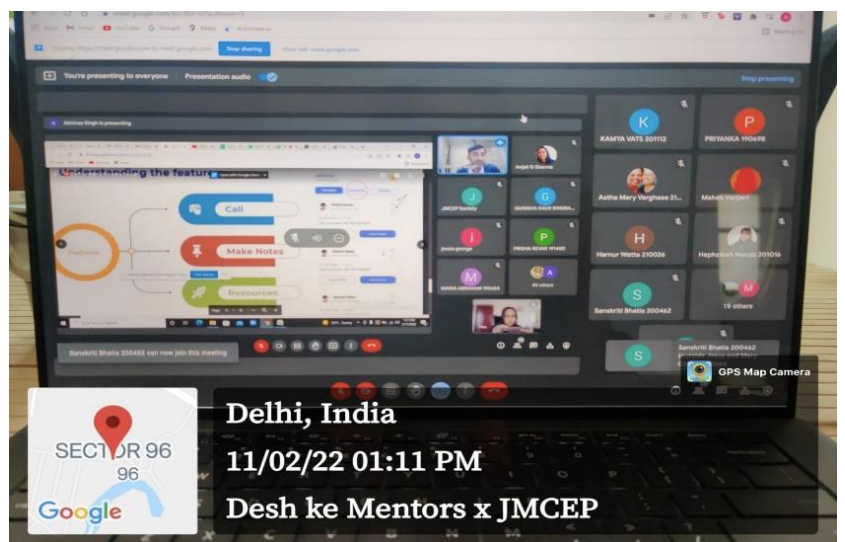
**Date of Event** – 6<sup>th</sup> December 2021

## PAPER BAG ACTIVITY



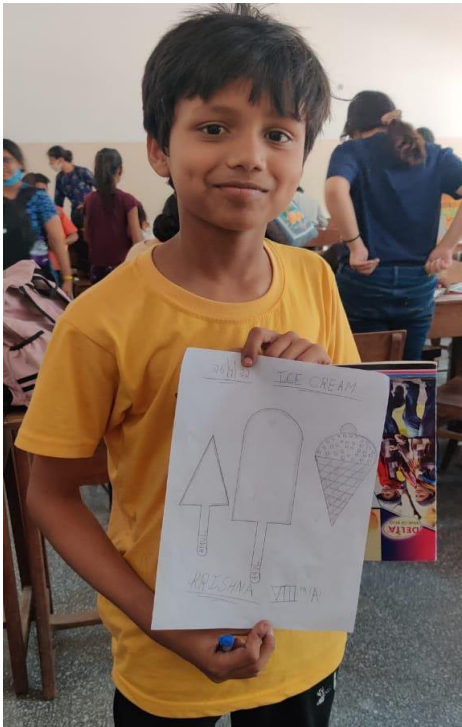
### **Date of Event – 25th April 2022**

## DRAWING ACTIVITY






**Date of Event** – 26th April 2022

She introduced Arushi Jain to us in 2021, the president in the 2021 session. Under her mentorship, we started the one-to-one tutoring campaign. This was an intense program. It was highly academically oriented. It required a one-year commitment from volunteers. Alongside, at SMCT we also began, the “**Ek Aur Prayas**” program to support school dropouts due to the pandemic, JMCEP volunteers supported us in that campaign too.

The mode of collaboration had been online, due to the pandemic. Mentors used zoom, Google Meet, and WhatsApp calls to teach. Almost 32 sessions were done during the 2020 – 21 session. It was beneficial for our students, and we are extremely grateful for the wholehearted involvement of students in giving back to society. JMCEP is doing a commendable contribution and we hope our association strengthens with every passing year.
