Ms. Dedhwal began the session with B. R. Ambedkar's famous quote, "I measure the progress of a community with the degree of progress women have achieved."

She also discussed how easily the role of women is overlooked, by giving the example of boards at construction sites which claim "Men at Work" behind which women are working just as diligently as any other man. As the discussion went on, Ms. Dedhwal made the students aware of the role of caste in gender politics and its effect on the New Education Policy (2020).

This session provided students with an opportunity to understand the concept of gender, as a hidden entity which affects their personal and public lives, being interwoven with their other identities.

## JMCEP x PANORAMA – FILM MAKING SOCIETY- JUICE MOVIE SCREENING



## Date of Event – 28<sup>th</sup> October, 2020

#### **Number of Participants** – 100

On the 28th of October, Panorama collaborated with JMCEP to conduct a screening and discussion of Neeraj Ghaywan's short film 'Juice'. 'Juice' exposes the gender problems and inequality implicit in the normalized family structure in India. After the screening, most of the participants had something to say. The film has been made in a way that invites discussion and interpretation. Many shared personal experiences that could be connected with the film's concerns. These concerns have therefore been selected in a way that personally touches most of the intended audience.

Several powerful and subtle scenes from the film were discussed. Everyone had something unique to bring to the fore, and all these perspectives made for a rich and nuanced dialogue. The film was recognised as well-rounded: it portrays both overt discrimination and internalization. The title was also recognised as rife with meaning. The discussion was not just nuanced and analytical, but also creative. The question of whether this relegation of women to the domestic is specific to India was then talked about. While household responsibilities seem to be shared more equitably in Western cultures (specifically the US), patriarchy manifests almost everywhere, just in different ways. The discussion ended with the point that there is still a long way to go to completely reform society. However, films and discussions such as these show that the process is underway.

# WEBINAR ON LEARNING DISABILITIES AMONG STUDENTS

#### Guest Speaker – Ms. Drishti Jaisingh

On 4<sup>th</sup> November 2020 from 1:10 pm to 2:00 pm, JMCEP had organized a workshop on "Learning Disabilities among students" for its members from the first year. The speaker Drishti Jaisingh, who is a Clinical Psychologist addressed the participants about students with 'special learning abilities'(SLD) through a pre recorded session. Drishti not just elaborated on learning disabilities and its causes among students, but also addressed about the alternative methods which volunteers of JMCEP could adhere to while coming across such situations. Apart from this, she discussed the current scenario of students with SLD in India and greatly emphasized on normalizing the presence of such students instead of making them or their parents conscious about their disabilities. After this the speaker answered to the questions written in the chat, followed by a vote of thanks. With this the session came to an end and everyone exited the meeting.

#### WEBINAR ON SKILL DEVELOPMENT AMONG TEACHERS




#### **Date of Event** – 6<sup>th</sup> November, 2020

On 6th November 2020, Jesus and Mary College Education Programme (JMCEP) hosted a workshop on the topic "Skill development among teachers" by Ms. Jayanti Mukherjee. The session started with Ms. Paridhi Puri, a JMCEP volunteer and moderator for this session, welcoming the speaker, Ms. Mukherjee. She began by talking about skill development. She talked about three very important factors- concentration, attention and listening. These could be achieved by asking smaller children to put their finger on the text while reading, asking indirect questions to the children about what they learnt from a particular story. She also asserted the importance of listening and retelling. Ms. Mukherjee spoke about the importance of worksheets and activities. It's imperative that kids develop gross motor skills and fine motor skills. She also talked about the importance of emotional control, teamwork and reasoning questions. Integrating all of this and the activities will make teaching a lively process. She concluded by asying that one day, like Friday, could be assigned specially for activities. This was followed by a short question and answer round.

On 11th November 2020, Jesus and Mary College Education Programme (JMCEP) organized a movie screening and discussion of the short film "Everything is fine" directed by Mansi Nirmal Jain. The moderator initiated the session explaining the aim and concept behind the movie screening. The movie "Everything is fine" showcases the tribulations of every mom next door. After the movie screening, discussion and interpretation of the film started. All the participants related to the movie and put forward their views. It was quite an informative and enlightening session for everyone. All volunteers shared their personal experiences and opinion. Various

themes were extracted from the movie, which are essential in these contemporary times. We impose over expectations on our mothers and sometimes fail to understand their desires and wishes. The discussion highlighted how divorces and separation are still considered taboo in India, especially in older age. We prefer to stay in an unhappy marriage just because of societal norms and pressure. The title of the movie was ironic in itself.

Further, everyone discussed how the ideology of patriarchy takes a more concrete turn in older women. The concept becomes normalized in society as if nothing is wrong with it, and women just accept it as part of life. The micro-scale achievements that are trivial for us can be uplifting and significant for our mom's. The motive of imparting the knowledge among our volunteers was a success. The discussion concluded on a note that appreciation of our mom's work is a must, and one should respect their wishes and desires. Normalizing this ideology in the stereotypical societal norms would be difficult but definitely not a far fetch goal. All volunteers enjoyed the session and gave a positive feedback.




## **DIWALI CAMPAIGN – ENACTUS COLLABORATION**


# INFLUENCE OF CINEMA ON CHILDREN: ESSAY WRTITING COMPETITION

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
