Webinar Summary

The speaker for the International webinar was Mr. Anup Kanti Deb, Director, Palo Alto Networks. The webinar began with a warm welcome by Dr. Indrakshi Dutta, Teacher-in-Charge, Department of Mathematics. Dr. Dutta thanks Sr. (Dr.) Rosily T.L. r.j.m., Principal and the entire webinar team for organising the International webinar before inviting Sr. Rosily to say a short prayer. Sr. Rosily welcomed the speaker and all the participants also with contextualising the topic of the webinar. Sr. Rosily, then, invoked the blessings of God on each and everyone present. Following this Dr. Shruti Tohan, Assistant Professor, Department of Mathematics, introduced the speaker and invited Mr. Deb to deliver his talk.

Mr. Deb thanked the Department of Mathematics and Sr. Rosily for giving him the opportunity to address the students and staff of JMC. He began by discussing the importance of cyber security in the way we handle technology, how cyber risk is first measured and identified and then mitigated. He discussed the rapidly changing and evolving technology and the digital transformation of our lives that has also expanded the complex threat landscape to which we are exposed. He further briefed the audience on the various malicious actors and adversaries who attack nations and individuals. He also discussed the methods being used by malicious actors in this evolving landscape of new technology and how these malicious actors are themselves changing and evolving in their use of new technology. Lastly, he discussed the simple ways in which we can embrace this new technology and also reduce these new risks and also how these methods are being used by various government agencies to protect citizens. Mr. Deb also introduced the various job prospects in cyber security industry and the skills that are required in an individual in this rapidly growing industry.

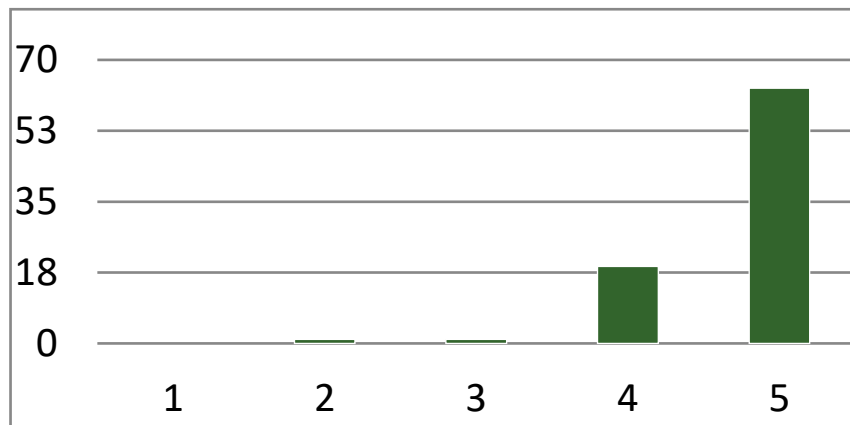

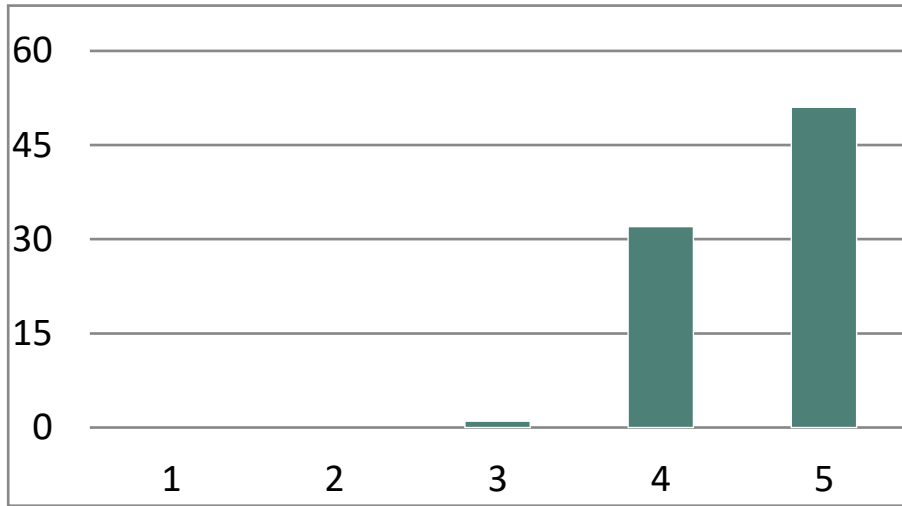
her unwavering support, Dr. Ameeta Motwani and the Webinar Committee. Lastly, she thanked the participants.

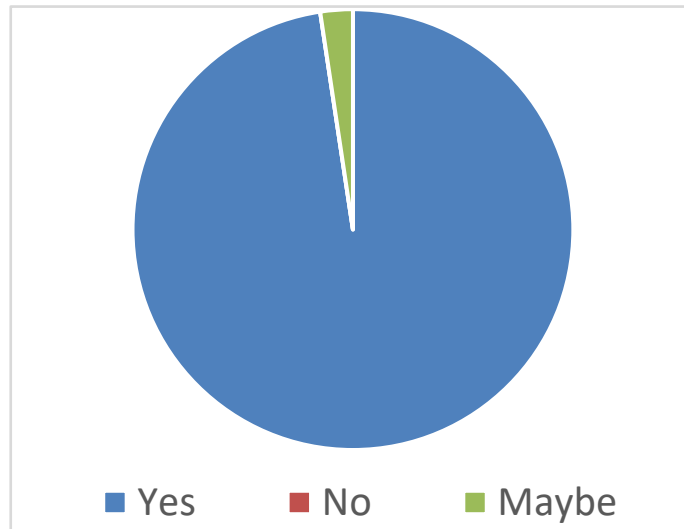
Relevance of the webinar to the participants (on a scale of 1 to 5):
