



Action Taken Report 2023-2024

- AQAR 2022-23 was submitted to NAAC within the stipulated timeline.
- As the University ushered into the second year of NEP 2020, IQAC organised many orientation and counselling sessions for the students in order to acquaint them and assist them in making informed choices about their courses. IQAC provided an interface amongst departments for a smooth implementation of Special Orientation Programmes were held for appraising the students and faculty about the changes implemented under the National Education Policy 2020. An NEP Committee has been formed to oversee the implementation issues and Challenges faced by the students and faculty with regard to the new Curricular framework.
- The IQAC also organized an Awareness and Capacity Building Program for the students in collaboration with the National Commission for Women. The program was attended by more than 300 students and certificates were distributed to the attendees and volunteers.
- To enhance our international collaborations a meeting was facilitated between Prof. Wendy Bignold, Liverpool Hope University and the teachers to take forward the collaboration between Jesus and Mary College, University of Delhi and Liverpool Hope University, UK.
- The Jesus and Mary College Library functioned 310 days in 2023-2024, acquired 770 books, and subscribed to 67 journals. The library's total collection reached 57224 books. It also enrolled for N-LIST, providing access to e-resources. The library organized orientation programs to introduce students to its services and facilities, including OPAC. Other enhancements included new wiring/networking for better Wi-Fi access, stock verification, and the addition of an Indian Constitution copy.
- The Web-based portal created for capturing, analysing and reporting data from Students, Faculty, Departments and Societies has been streamlined to adapt to the reporting requirements of the College for NAAC, NIRF, AISHE etc. In addition to this a robust system to process the choices of the courses offered to the students in NEP has been designed.
- The IQAC facilitated the promotions of one teacher: one Assistant Professor was promoted from Stage 11 to Stage 12. This year was a significant year in terms of hiring

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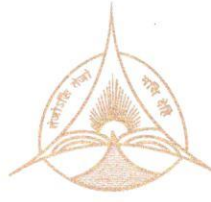

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of permanent faculty members. JMC hired 67 teachers across 13 departments. The new members were inducted.

- Maintenance of infrastructure as well as upkeep of safety and security equipment is carried out regularly in a systematic manner through professional experts.
- The IQAC under the leadership of the Principal has taken the initiative to collect and analyse the feedback from all stakeholders, namely, students, faculty, administrative staff, parents, alumni and employers. The principal communicated the feedback at the appropriate forums and initiated corrective measures wherever necessary.
- Various talks (40), Seminars, special lectures on aspects related to quality enhancement in higher education, research, publications, Assessment, Community Engagement were organized. A talk by Dr. Kiran Bedi on Women: Agents of Social Transformation. JMC collaborated with Delhi Police for Project Sugam's washroom construction near Kamla Market police station.
- NEP 2020 envisages that the students spend time understanding and contributing to the society. to take this idea ahead the community engagement cell collaborated with various NGOs like Chetanalaya, Schumacher, and Pratyek to place the students of JMC in various internships.
