18. SWOC Analysis

Strengths The biggest strength of the Department is the dynamic faculty which has ensured that the students have exposure to a myriad of curricular, co-curricular (including research) and extra-curricular events. Teachers have been actively engaged in keeping their skills up to date by attending regular faculty development programs. The Department has an International Collaboration with the QED group, USA and a National Collaboration with the Meghnad Desai Academy, Mumbai. Strong link between the Department and alumni exists. They are now engaging with the current students by delivering talks and providing details of job and internship opportunities. The Department has set up a Research Cell with the purpose of social outreach and providing students with field experience. The students have followed up the field work that was done previously with research papers on their areas of interest and conducting outreach activities. During the Covid times they have worked under the faculty members on several research papers and some of them have been published in peer reviewed journals. Students of the department have interned with faculty members on government sponsored projects The Department has built capacities for online teaching to ensure uninterrupted progress of teaching during COVID-19 lockdown. Weakness The number of publications in Scopus indexed journals, UGC journals and peer-reviewed journals have been relatively low. Opportunities Given the COVID-19 lockdown and the shift of teaching from physical to online mode, students and teachers are now very comfortable with web platforms. This has become an advantage as it will become easier to get academicians from across the globe to engage with students through webinars and this will add immense value to student's learning. Research collaborations with foreign universities have become easier now with the online mode of teaching. Challenges One of the major challenges faced by the Department is balancing time between co-curricular activities and extra-curricular activities, and focussing on core academic tasks in an extremely packed semester system with overlapping semesters. With the COVID-19 lock down it will be a challenge for the department to conduct co-curricular activities which have been an integral part of the student's learning and training.

19. Future Plans

Teacher-student mentoring on academic and non-academic fronts is already being undertaken by the Department. We plan to introduce a Buddy Programme involving senior students mentoring their juniors. The Programme aims to foster learning by ensuring that newer batches get support on career, studies and extracurricular activities from their seniors. To further community outreach, the Department plans to organize a visit to an old age home. Overtime, the Department plans to adopt an old age home and ensure regular engagement with the sameTo strengthen Alumni network, the Department will be inviting more alumni speakers for lectures to College. This will also immensely help the current students with placements and career opportunities. To develop critical thinking skills and propel discussions among students, the Department plans to increase the frequency of Reading Circles and form a Book Club.
