THIS YEAR WE STARTED SOME NEW INITIATIVES. WE HAD FOR THE FIRST TIME AN ORAL HISTORY WORKSHOP IN WHICH STUDENTS WERE TRAINED IN PARALLEL SESSIONS ON THE METHODOLOGY OF ORAL HISTORY. WE HAD INVITED Professor Surajit Sarkar (Centre for Community Knowledge, Ambedkar University) who has worked on Oral history of Delhi; and, Miss. Aanchal Malhotra (Artist, Author and Oral History Practitioner) who has worked on Partition, Oral History and material culture. THE SESSION WAS MUCH APPRECIATED BY ALL THE PARTICPANTS. STUDENTS REGISTERED FOR THE WORKSHOP FROM OTHER COLLEGES AS WELL AND WE HAD A PARTICIPATION OF APPROXIMATELY 90 STUDENTS. Both the resource people expressed keenness to collaborate with JMC History Department for Oral history projects especially for the ongoing one at Ambedkar University on Delhi headed by Prof. Sarkar. Dr. Richa Raj and Dr. Saumya Varghese will be following up on this in the new academic session.

The department also organized a two day educational trip to Alwar under the mentorship of Dr. Amita Paliwal and Dr. Richa Raj. The students were familiarized with many historical edifices of the Medieval and Modern periods.

The department also organized for the first time a freshers debate in which many first year students from across departments participated.

This year we also won the second prize (first runners up trophy) in the sports day march past. The teachers and students also were working hard on the Students Paper Prsentation and Seminar and we had received and shortlisted many paper for the final presentation that was scheduled in the last week of March. However because of the Covid lockdown it couldn't be continued.

The department has applied for a masters programme in History. The papers were duly forwarded to the Registrar and Vice Chancellor of the University by the Teacher in charge Dr. Saumya Varghese and are being followed up by Dr. Richa Raj. Hopefully this semester once the situation resumes normalcy post Covid lockdown our request would be deliberated by the University.

The department has done its small contribution to the Anti-plastic drive by JMC Green society by ensuring that at none of the events organized plastic serveware was used. Likewise the teachers and students are striving towards retraining from the use of plastic waterbottles, lunchbox etc as a small gesture of their contribution to the environment.

THE STUDENTS GUIDED BY TEACHER MENTORS WERE ABLE TO SECURE AWARDS AND SELECTION IN COMPETITIVE PAPER PRESENTATIONS AND JOURNALS RESPECTIVELY.

WE HAVE BEEN ABLE TO CONTINUE WITH THE ACADEMIC TALKS, TOURS, HERITAGE WALKS, WORKSHOPS, STUDENT PAPER SUBMISSIONS DESPITE THE CHALLENGES OF DISRUPTED ACADEMIC YEAR. ALL THE TEACHERS OF THE DEPARTMENT HAVE BEEN PROVIDING ONLINE LECTURES AND GUIDANCE BEFORE AND DURING LOCKDOWN PERIOD.

THE TEACHERS AND STUDENTS HAVE ALSO PUBLISHED IN JOURNALS, ENGAGED IN PAPER PRESENTATIONS ETC. SOME OF OUR FACULTY HAVE VISITED INTERNATIONAL UNIVERSITIES SUCH AS HARVARD, U.S.A; COLUMBIA UNIVERSITY, U.S.A and TOKYO AS RESOURCE PEOPLE OR AS PARTICIPANTS OF SHORT TERM COURSES.

THE DEPARTMENT HAS ALSO CONTINUED WITH ITS COLLECTION DRIVES –CLOTHING, FOOD ETC THAT HAVE BEEN DISTRIBUTED TO THE NEEDY.

OUR STUDENTS PERFORMED WELL IN THE SPORTS DAY ORGANISED BY JMC AND THE HISTORY DEPARTMENT WAS THE FIRST RUNNERS UP IN THE MARCH PAST.

OUR STUDENTS HAVE WHOLEHEARTEDLY HELPED AND PARTICIPATED IN THE ORGANISATION COMMITTEES OF MONTAGE, SPORTS DAY, PTSA, NSS AND OTHER COLLEGE ACTIVITIES.

THOUGH THE MASTER'S IN HISTORY PROGRAMME WAS ENVISONED WE HAVE NOT BEEN YET ABLE TO LAUNCH IT AS THE UNIVERSITY HAS NOT DELIBERATED UPON OUR SUBMISSIONS IN ITS AC/EC MEETING. IN THIS REGARD THE DEPARTMENT MEMBERS WOULD SOON BE FOLLOWING UP THE STATUS OF THE SUBMITTED FILE AND WORK TOWARDS INITIATING THE MASTERS IN HISTORY IN JESUS AND MARY COLLEGE.

THE DEPARTMENT TEACHERS HAVE BEEN CONSISTENT IN **ONLINE** TEACHING and ASSESSMENT THROUGH VARIOUS PORTALS.

HOWEVER TILL NOW THOSE WORKING WITH GOOGLE CLASSROOM HAVE USED THEIR PERSONAL GMAIL ACCOUNTS TO INITIATE IT.

THE DEPARTMENT IN THIS CONTEXT WOULD BE MAKING A STRONG APPEAL TO THE JESUS AND MARY COLLEGE ADMINISTRATION TO INITIATE THE PROVIDING OF G-SUITE ACCOUNTS TO ALL THE STUDENTS OF HISTORY SO THAT GOOGLE CLASSROOMS CAN BE CREATED USING THE INSTITUTIONAL EMAILS OF THE TEACHERS AND STUDENTS. THIS WOULD PROVIDE FOR BETTER CO-ORDINATION AND FACILITATE A QUALITATIVE IMPROVEMENT IN COMMUNICATING WITH OUR STUDENTS.

SINCE THE STUDENT PAPER PRESENTATION AND SEMINAR OF THE YEAR 2020 HAD GOT STALLED BECAUSE OF THE PANDEMIC INDUCED LOCKDOWN WE WOULD BE KEEN ON HAVING A VIRTUAL PAPER PRESENTATION SEMINAR AND CONFERENCE.
