Strengths

- ❖ Student feedback both online and offline, on the course(s) taught encouraged/ obtained.

- ❖ Well stocked library and availability of Internet.
- ❖ Department room is spacious and airy.

- ❖ Students in last three years have assumed president (6) and vice president (6) roles in various societies.
- ❖ In last three- four years, more of our students have joined internship programmes and short term courses to hone in their skills and increase their career opportunities.

WEAKNESSES

- ❖ Need to fill up permanent posts in view of retirement in recent years.

OPPORTUNITIES

- ❖ More incentives and support on the part of the management to teachers for their research would be welcome.

CHALLENGES

- ❖ Need to revamp the existing mentor-ward system. At present it is informally done. Major hurdle is back to back classes of students. Difficulty in fixing a slot when both the mentor and ward are free.
- ❖ Students are taught how to write a research paper but this needs to be executed across the board by all department teachers.
- ❖ Separate shelving of books prescribed in the university syllabus, if made possible would be student friendly.
