### 6. Library Development:

Library occupies three floors of a four-storeyed building. It is fully air-conditioned and fully automated by "TROODON SOFTWARE PACKAGE" which is an integrated multi-user library management system.

\* The Library acquired 849 books during 2015-2016 and also subscribed to 79 National Journals and 16 Foreign Journals. The total collection of the Library has been increased to 52710 books. (46307 General Books +4975 Donated Books +1428 Book Bank)

#### Layout plan of each floor

\* **GROUND FLOOR:** The ground floor of the library has circulation counter, Online Public Access Catalogue, Processing Section, Textbook section and total seating capacity is 40 for students and 10 for teachers + 6 computers are for Internet facility.

All the periodicals and magazines are displayed alphabetically on the ground floor with their previous issues in the same rack.

- \* FIRST FLOOR: The first floor has the Text-Book Section and a big reading hall with total 170 seating capacity. Two computers with OPAC facility are available on first floor also, where the staff and students can search the location of required books easily.
- \* **SECOND FLOOR:** The second floor is dedicated to the reference collection, book bank and one big room is for e-Resource Centre where 20 nodes for accessing the internet and e-resources are available for faculty.
- \* We have also renewed the membership of British Council Library. 10 cards have been issued by the BCL for books and journals. These cards can be accessed by students and faculty members as and when required.
- \* We are also the member of **N-List (INFLIBNET)** in which the User can easily access 6000 e-journals and 97000 e-books anywhere with their user ID and Password and our college is in the

#### Best 10 users list.

- \* A ramp with smooth handrail is available at the college library entrance for facilitation to the visually/physically challenged students
- \* One toilet with ramp is available on ground floor. Spacious toilet for accommodating wheel chair is available for PH students.
- \* Brallie language documents provided by the university are made available to visually challenged users. Material required by the PwD users is supplied at their desk within the library on priority basis by the library staff.
