Slogan Writing Competition

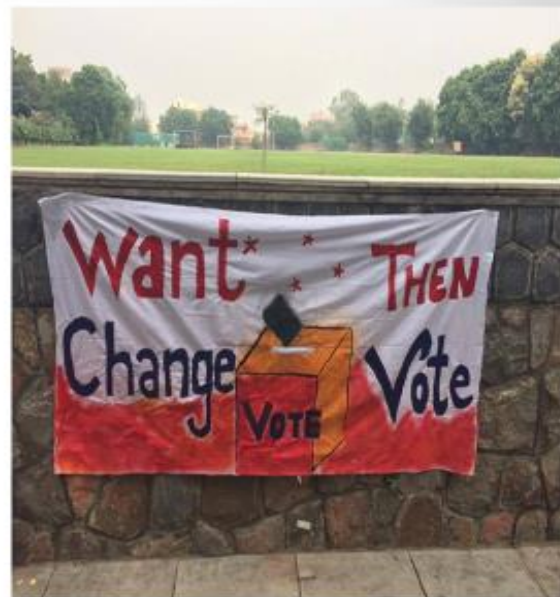
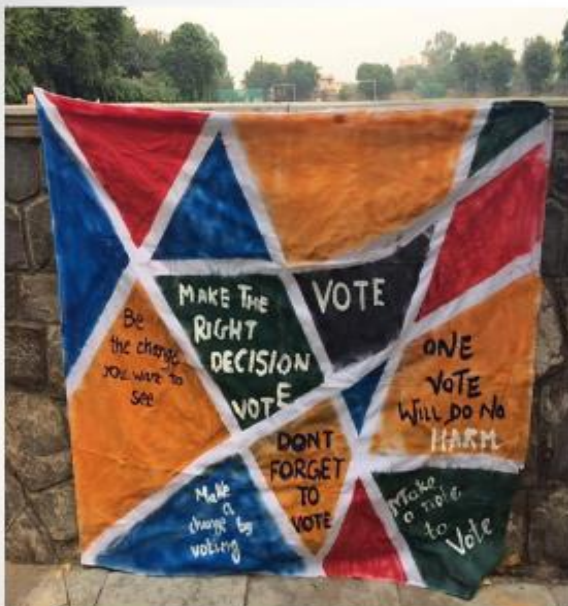

International Women's Day

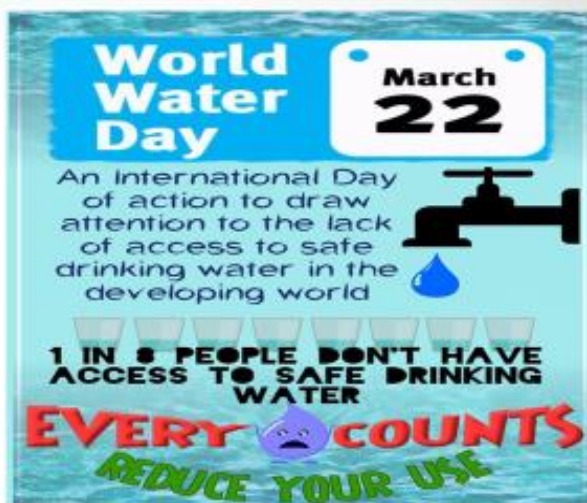
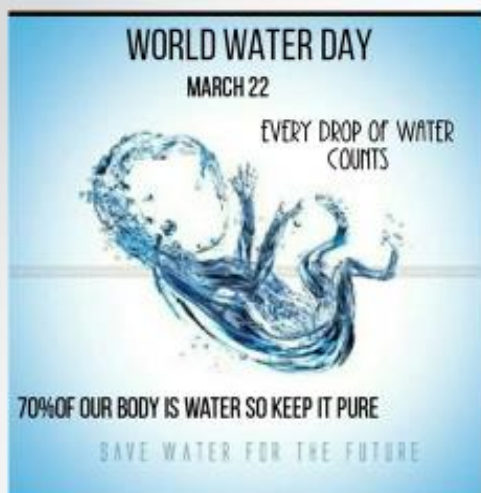

Dr. Maya John has been Convener of the WSC since August 2016. WSC is one of the compulsory societies of the college. The co-convener since August 2016 has been Dr. Susan George.

On an average all the events mentioned below witnessed the participation of four to five staff advisors i.e. teachers associated with the WSC.

Despite some very consistent work and sensitization of students, WSC does not work towards formal awards. Till September 2017 we were a UGC-sponsored women's study centre. Since UGC funding has been discontinued with the XIIth plan coming to an end, we have become a self-financed women's study centre.

Report of Extension Activities

Jesus And Mary College Educational Programme (JMCEP)

Jesus and Mary College Education Programme is a student initiative aimed at empowering school children from poor sections in Chanakyapuri through education and values that go beyond the concise boundaries of textbooks. The society hence strives to narrow the gap between poverty and equitable quality education.

Activities organized during the year 2016 – 2017

150 students from the college registered as members of JMCEP to teach 176 children between nursery to Class XI from neighbouring colonies of Bapu Dham, Vivekananda Camp, and children of construction workers residing within the campus.

The JMCEP classes were conducted in the afternoon from Monday to Friday. In collaboration with other societies and NGOs, various activities were organized throughout the year aiming at the holistic development of children.

Collaboration with Enactus: On 8th September, 2016, the societies came together to spread awareness about Dengue and Chikungunya to the children. Various ways of prevention and protection against the flu were explained and discussed. As a part of the awareness drive, Odomos tubes were also distributed to the children.

Film Screening for Children: On 20th October, 2016, 'The Jungle Book' was screened for children, marking the end of their examinations. The children enjoyed every bit of it. It seemed to be an immersive experience for them as they talked about and could feel the characters' sufferings and joys as their own after the screening. Ankita Mehra (Political Science, 2nd year) presented a brief conclusion focusing on the issue of animal sensitization.

Documentary Screening: On 18th January, 2017, a documentary titled 'A Teacher's Journey' was screened for the volunteers. The documentary, through actual classroom episodes from a single teacher school in India, highlights challenges and joys of teaching. And most importantly discusses what it takes to be a teacher. It also covers certain innovative practices that the teachers and students co-engaged with in a multi-level classroom. After the screening, JMCEP students, with a renewed motivation and enthusiasm, shared their own JMCEP journeys with the children so far – recollecting and reflecting on their experiences, sharing the ups and downs.

Collaboration with CRY: Various activities, including storytelling, art and craft sessions, were

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organized for children in collaboration with Child Rights and You to stimulate imagination and free expression. A book collection drive was initiated in collaboration with CRY and NSS in January, wherein hundreds of children's books were being contributed by college students. Books collected were later being used for the storytelling and reading sessions with children. Storytelling paved the path for incorporating rich and meaningful ways of enhancing the skills of speaking, reading and writing. It has been decided as a team to gift these books to the children as a token of appreciation for being an integral part of the programme in the upcoming get together.



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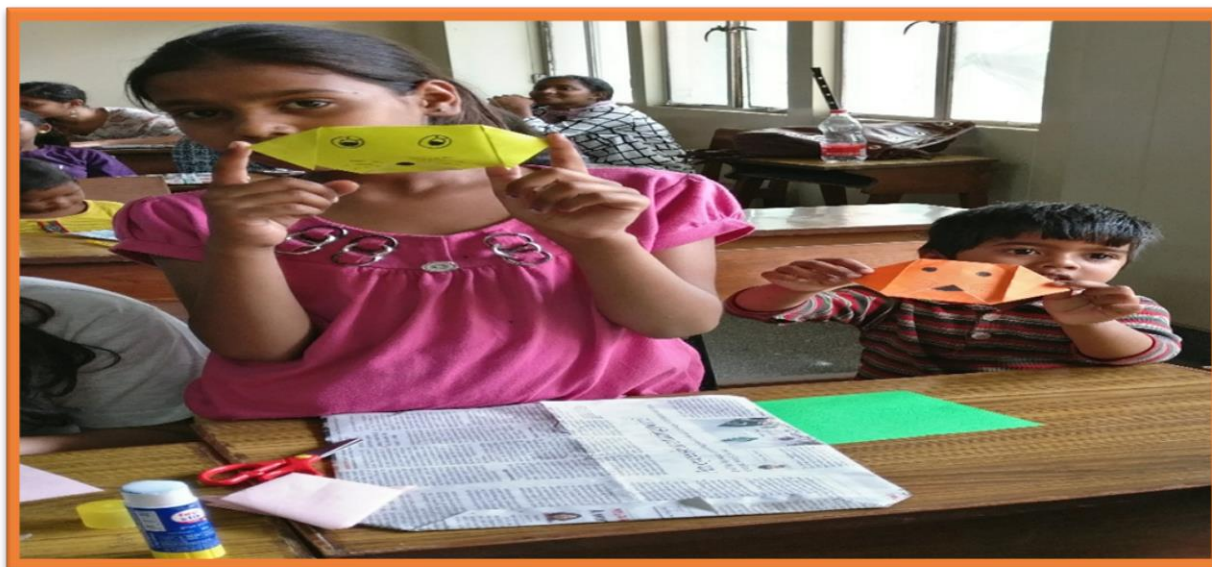

Enactus, which stands for **Entrepreneurial Action in Us**, is an international non-profit organization which strives towards a better world and better future through entrepreneurial action. At Enactus JMC, our objective is to empower people from marginalized segments to transform opportunities into real, sustainable progress for themselves and their communities. Our current team has 37 students from various departments of the college. Since its inception, Enactus JMC team has undertaken various projects – Project Unnati, Project Sahan and Project Chaak. Currently we are working on two projects – Youth Employability Program and Project Dhara.

Our **Youth Employability Project (Y.E.P.)** aims to empower and uplift youth from socially and economically backward communities by creating employment opportunities through soft skills and vocational training.

Our vision is to reduce the gap between the large unemployed youth and job opportunities, and to build productive communities of young people capable of self-directed growth and positive citizenship.

The project is exclusively designed for youth (18-25 years of age) who have been denied of opportunities due to their underprivileged background (school dropouts, unemployed secondary, school graduates, street youth, orphans, for example).

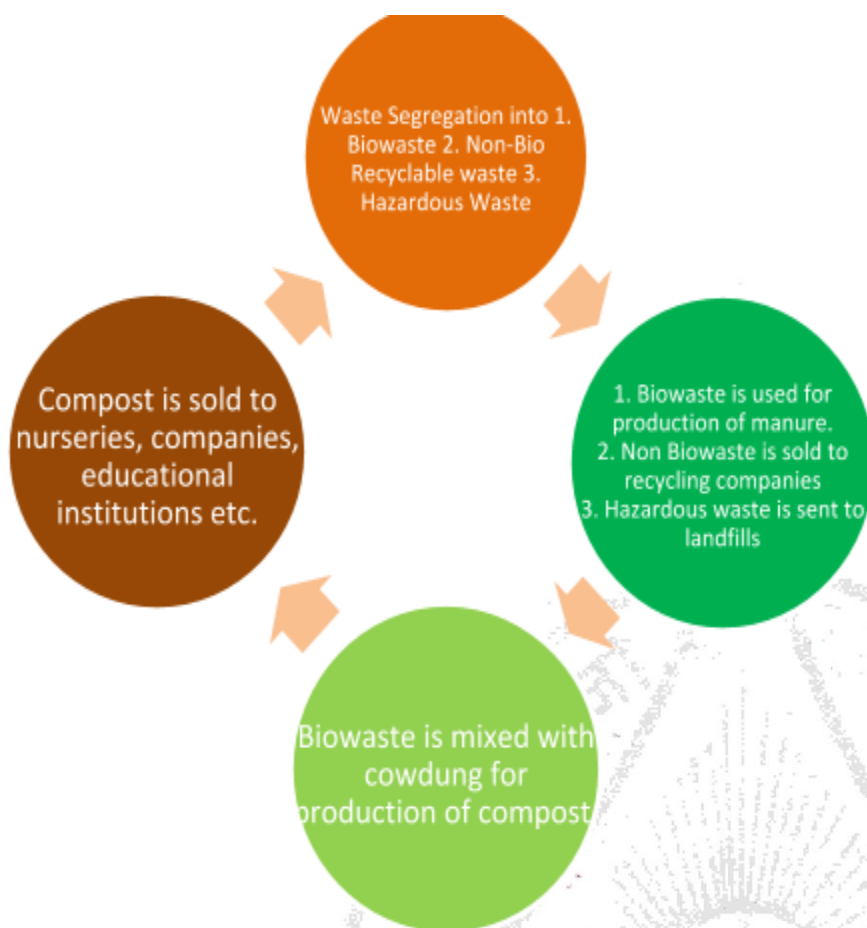
Our current batch consists of 27 trainees and the training program is provided by Prowisdom Growth Ltd, our training partners. The curriculum includes subjects like interpersonal skills, goal setting, time management, confidence building, communication skills, career planning, leadership skills, resume writing, interview facing skills and basic computer skills, thus bridging the gap between the education system and the employment market as well as ensuring individual attention and a positive environment for growth and enlightenment. We then place our trainees in sectors like retail, management, data entry etc. We attempt to ensure that they find jobs where they not only earn stable incomes, but also find opportunities for growth and learning.



Project Dhara was started in October 2016 with an aim to establish a waste segregation system whilst providing employment opportunities for women who hail from Vivekananda slum near Jesus and Mary College. The project targets to empower urban impoverished women and make them into entrepreneurs of tomorrow.

Currently, we've employed 6 women, who have been trained by the Indian Agricultural Research Institute, for production of vermi-compost.

The waste segregation cycle is an extension of our project and is directed towards segregating waste at its source and using the biodegradable waste as a raw material for producing manure.



We have completed one waste segregation cycle in our college and the production of our first batch of manure. Presently, we are working on quality tests, labeling, packaging and marketing of our

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product. We envision a greener and healthier environment, by production and promotion of natural composts in houses and fields.

Enactus JMC's efforts have received positive reviews in DU Beat and University Express .We also have a strong social media presence on platforms such as Facebook, Twitter and Instagram.

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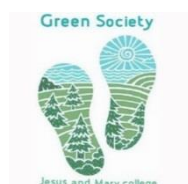


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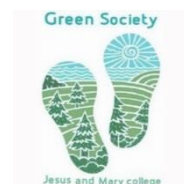

The National Cadet Corps at Jesus and Mary College was incorporated in January, 1974. The objective of the society has always been to uphold the motto of NCC- Unity and Discipline. It moulds our cadets into disciplined, hardworking and patriotic citizens in the service of our nation. In 1978, Ruby Williams of JMC was the first girl cadet to fly solo and the first girl to get a private flying license; and from then the society has never looked back.

In the recently concluded academic year of 2016- 17, the society has achieved even greater heights and the girls have performed profoundly well. The society believes in holistic development and organized activities like- **International Yoga Day, Swachha Bhaarat Campaign, Road Safety Awareness Drive**. The Road Safety Awareness Program was a huge success with cadets participating in catching traffic violators on Bapu Dham road and San Martin Marg- illegal parking of vehicles and jumping of traffic signal; along with distribution of road safety pamphlets. The cell started its functioning under the aegis of our coordinator Dr. Amita Tiwari, with Dr. Rashi Mukhopadhyay and Dr. Disha Narula as members. Dr Savita Rastogi took over the charge in October. The year began with the election of the president (Priyanka Choudhary), vice-president (Kajal Mishra), and the core team.

The cell organized a talk by Prof. Prem Singh (Professor Emeritus, University of Delhi) on 11th January, 2017. Prof Prem Singh, a visually challenged teacher, shared with us her journey as a specially-abled person and challenges she faced. She narrated how different people at different stages of life encouraged her to go ahead and discover herself, her capacities and achieve great heights in life. She ended her talk with recitation of poems she has written over a period of time.

On 16 January 2017, intra-college competitions were held on and students participated in them with great enthusiasm. On 18 January, 2017, a fund raiser was organized where bake and games stalls were put up by the core team members. **The EOC also organised a movie screening "ACCSEX" on 8 February 2017.** This film explores notions of beauty, the 'ideal body' and sexuality through four storytellers; four women who happen to be differently-abled. The film brings to the fore questions of acceptance, confidence and resistance to the normative. As it turns out, these questions are not too removed from everyday realities of several others, deemed 'imperfect' and 'monstrous' for not fitting in. ACCSEX traces the journeys of the storytellers as they reclaim agency and the right to unapologetic confidence, sexual expression and happiness.

Dr Rastogi, together with vice president Kajal Mishra, attended a day-long event on empowering disability at Bharti College, University of Delhi on the 31st of January. During MONTAGE'17, the annual cultural festival of the college, the EOC organised inter-college competitions on 17th February, 2016, and singing, dancing and creative writing competitions were held. Students from various colleges participated in these with great enthusiasm.

EOC celebrated **National Science Day on the theme: Science and Technology for Specially Abled Persons** on 28 February 2017 by organizing talks by two speakers. The first speaker was Dr. Anita Ghai who spoke on 'Reflecting on issues of Gender and Disability from lens of Reproductive Technology.' She is a disability rights activist in the areas of education, health, sexuality and gender. She has been a Fellow at the Nehru Memorial Museum Library, Teen Murti Bhawan, and has also been the president of the Indian Association for Women's Studies. The second speaker of the day was Yogacharya Sh. Jagmaal who shared his views on 'Contribution of science of Yoga and Ayurveda in the proper development of mankind.

The EOC celebrated its **annual festival UNNATI** on March 6, 2017. It was our attempt to increase understanding and ensure that specially-abled individuals have the opportunities to fulfil their



potential. Through our endeavours, we brought in a mélange of differently abled students across all colleges for a day-long event filled with different activities. The key note speaker for this event was Mr. Sidh Taneja. He is specially-abled person, living with cerebral palsy, who does all his work with toes.

He cycles, treks, and participates in other adventure activities without any hesitation. He is part of several NGO's like Ability Foundation to help specially-abled people of society. He is a reputed employee of Make My Trip. He has received various awards such as 13th Cavinkare Ability Award (2015). He has addressed crowds at IIT Delhi along with Deep Kalra (Founder and Group CEO, Make My Trip) at their event U X NOW. It was a great honour to listen him and it made us reflect about ourselves and wonder that if he, despite all his physical limitations, can be a person with great temperament, attitude and undying spirit, we can surely become more enthusiastic and aspire towards changing our outlook for the better.

In addition to this, inter-college singing and creative writing competitions were held and Ad- Mad competitions were held for all the students. Cash prizes and certificates were given to the winners and certificates of participation were also distributed. The event was partly sponsored by Federal Bank and our media partners were the DU Express and the Education Tree.
