Work undertaken by various societies to promote gender equity:

The understanding of equals and parallels amongst all the genders stands as one of the most imperative practices in an emerging society. **Jesus and Mary College** has been proactively involved in carving out measures for promotion of gender equity. Varied pedagogical practices and methods have been adopted to understand and inculcate exploration of gender equity and equality in ways of talks, workshops, campaigns, training sessions.

Community Engagement Centre, Jesus and Mary College celebrated **International Women's Day**, observed on 11th February every year since 2015on the theme Digit-all: Innovation and Technology for Gender Equality on 6th March 2023. The event included a talk on women's empowerment by Prof. Amita Tiwari, IGNOU Centre, JMC, an informative session on financial literacy by ICICI Foundation and an instructive session on mobile literacy.

The National Service Scheme of Jesus and Mary College, also celebrated **The International Day of Women and Girls in Science.** The intra college event was held on 14<sup>th</sup> February,2023 within the college premises decorating the NSS board around 2023 the topic women in science and technology.

The institution relentlessly directs efforts in field of promoting health awareness for women. CEC of Jesus and Mary college in collaboration with Kailash Satyarthi Children's Foundation organized an awareness session on **Menstrual Hygiene Day** on 26th May and distributed women's hygiene products to women from the community.

To commemorate **The National Girl Child Day**, NSS unit of JMC organized an online viewing of the feature film "I am Greta" on  $24^{th}$  January 2023 followed with analysis of the movie and protatgonist.

Women's Studies Centre of Jesus and Mary College has attempted to challenge the gender unequals in the society. An enlightening talk held on 30<sup>th</sup> January, 2023 that **decoded heteronormativity through the lens of ancient, medieval and contemporary literature** over an online platform. The workshop shattered aimed to demystify heternormative beliefs and help expand students horizons and look at the world with all its plurality. Various texts like Baburnama, Mahabharata, and Kamasutra were brought into focus.

WSC In collaboration with the Equal Opportunity Cell, hosted Open Mic event - *Zarafat* on November 7, 2022. The event focused on the legacy of Frida Kahlo, focusing on her life and contributions to feminist discourse. The event successfully showcased the talent, creativity, and passion of the JMC student community.

the idea of dispossession amongst women was also explored by WSC. The society organised an event titled *"Writing the World: In Conversation with Dr Nitasha Kaul"*. The conversation focused on the nuanced topic of feminist documentation of narratives of dispossession. Dr. Kaul's latest novel, "Future Tense," catalysed exploring the importance of a woman's language in tracing competing trajectories of modernity and tradition, freedom and suffocation. WSC also organised a screening of the documentary *Writing with Fire* by Rintu Thomas and Sushmit Ghosh on 31st January 2023.

WSC organised two reading and discussion circles focusing on the influential book "The Dialectic of Sex: The Case for Feminist Revolution" by Shulamith Firestone. The sessions, presided over by Dr. Sandhya Nambiar, aimed to explore the profound insights and revolutionary ideas presented in Firestone's work. Participants had the opportunity to critically analyse Firestone's arguments, questionestablished norms and beliefs, introspect and engage in dialogue.

The annual fest of WSC - *Jagriti* was organized on 5th and 6th April 2023. It was an attempt to create a diverse, dynamic and safe space for young students to engage with feminist discourses in multiple ways. As a part of the two day fest a student seminar was organised on the theme *Ghare/Baire (Home, Self and theWorld): Definitions, Contestations and Identities.* The seminar hosted 10+ papers from participants across the institutions of Delhi. A debate competition, a blackout poetry competition, a fundraiser, an open mic event - Jansunvai along with an art exhibition on women political prisoners were part of Jagriti. There were two keynote speakers, Deepa Shad and Vqueeram Aditya Sahai, who gave their wonderful insights during the Opening and the Closing Ceremony.

Apart from this, the Centre also works upon its annual magazine - Jigyasa and various independent research projects. We constantly release statements of solidarity and condemnation on issues of contemporary importance.

#### SAFETY AND SECURITY

• JMC as has always attempted to offer physical safety to its student promoting their personal growth and welfare.

• The campus is well secured by trained guards, police presence and strong check at the time of gate entry.

• The college has a total of five gates, only two are used for regular passage with securityguards manning these gates at all times. The other three gates remain locked, except on special occasions and with strong monitoring.

• At the time of festivals and other events, the safety of students is ensured by securing the premises with police presence, guards, teaching and non teaching staff at the entry gate.

• JMC as an institution acknowledges the importance of having institutional safeguards to promote student safety. As per the Sexual Harassment at Workplace (Prevention and Prohibition) Act 2013 and UGC Regulations 2015, JMC constituted an Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) which remains active and is easily accessible to the college students and employees. Information of the ICC members is displayed in important places in the college and on the college website.

• The ICC constitutes of members from the teaching and nonteaching staff, elected student representatives and an external member. For its seamless functioning, ICC organizes a session every year to educate students about legal conceptualization of sexual harassment and the procedure for filing a complaint with the ICC.

• Continuing to promote student safety and welfare, JMC is one of the few DU colleges that has an Parent Teacher Student Association

(PTSA) to keep parentsabreast of their ward's progress and interact with teachers and to air their concerns. It recognizes parents as imperative stakeholders in the progression of the students hence, aims to strengthen the combined efforts of institution and parents in building the young adults.

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#### **COMMON ROOM**
